The Lutheran Theological Seminary offers two degreeprograms: a Masters of Protestant Theology and the Theological Exam for those who are called to pastoral ministry. Both are fully accredited by the state of Germany and recognized by other major German churches, as well as many churches around the world. The Seminary is supported by the Selbständige Evangelisch-Lutherische Kirche (SELK – the Independent Lutheran Church in Germany).

Studying at the LThH opens a whole world of study possibilities. You can take courses at the nearby universities in Frankfurt and Mainz and change to another university without losing any progress towards your degree. And, did we mention that our fees are very low? In fact, you can even apply for a variety of fellowships to support your living costs while you study.

Both degrees encompass the full spectrum of theological topics from a Lutheran perspective. Our particular research emphases concentrate on the Lutheran Confessions as well as biblical research.
